WHEREAS the LGD of Pinawa acknowledges the importance of a strong partnership with the Pinawa Community Development Corporation (PCDC) to foster economic growth and development within the region, and WHEREAS the Council recognizes the benefits of maintaining an arms-length relationship with the PCDC to promote independent decision-making and efficiency of council resources, and

WHEREAS it is essential to ensure regular communication and reporting between the PCDC and the LGD of Pinawa for better coordination of strategic planning and project implementation, and

WHEREAS by maintaining distance from the council, the PCDC can operate independently, making decisions based on its mission and goals without political interference.

WHEREAS it is a strategic priority of the PCDC to develop and enter into a Service/Funding Agreement with the LGD of Pinawa to outline requirements. WHEREAS promoting an atmosphere of collaboration and cooperation between the two organizations will yield positive outcomes for the residents of Pinawa and the region, and

WHEREAS cost savings to the taxpayers of Pinawa can be achieved by limiting the number of council members serving on the PCDC board,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Council of the LGD of Pinawa officially recognizes the arms-length nature of the Pinawa Community Development Corporation (PCDC).
- 2. The LGD of Pinawa develop and enter into a Service/Funding Agreement with the PCDC and outline requirements.
- 3. All members of the Council may participate in strategic planning sessions organized by the PCDC to foster open dialogue and collaboration.
- 4. The PCDC shall provide a quarterly report to the Council, detailing the state of the Pinawa and regional economy, ongoing projects, upcoming projects, progress in implementing the strategic plan, and short-term and medium-term plans.
- 5. It is recommended that the PCDC amend their relevant by-laws to reflect this resolution accordingly as soon as is practicable. CARRIED.

Whereas, the government aims to increase efficiency and transparency in its decision-making processes,

Whereas, standing committees of council play a vital role in providing recommendations to the council,

Whereas, to ensure the independence of committees, it is necessary to cap the number of council members serving on each committee, preventing a quorum of council from dominating any committee's decision-making,

Whereas, studies have shown that groups of two tend to produce more equitable results compared to groups of three,

Whereas, better reporting and evidence are essential for informed decision-making, and encouraging the convincing of the council fosters thoroughness in committee recommendations,

Whereas, optimizing the allocation of council resources allows councillors to focus their efforts on fewer committees, leading to more effective and focused work, Whereas, managing the number of non-council committees a councillor can sit on promotes equal power distribution among council members and ensures responsible resource utilization,

Whereas, setting term limits for committee appointments enhances transparency, fosters fresh perspectives, and supports democratic practices,

Whereas, councillors' active participation in committees contributes to the effective functioning of these bodies,

Whereas it is desirable to manage the amount of meetings in order to conserve council and administrative resources while ensuring that effective governance is carried out,

Whereas, conflicts of interest need to be avoided to maintain integrity and public trust,

Therefore, be it resolved that the following measures shall be implemented:

- 1. Standing committees of council shall be limited to two sitting council members per committee, to ensure independence and unbiased decision-making.
- 2. Groups of two council members shall be formed in committees to facilitate more equitable outcomes.
- 3. Committees shall be required to produce comprehensive reports and evidence, promoting thoroughness in their recommendations.
- 4. Councillors' involvement in committees shall be managed, allowing them to serve on a limited number of non-council committees to balance power and resource allocation.
- 5. A term limit of two consecutive years shall be established for all committee appointments to enhance transparency and encourage fresh perspectives.
- 6. Councillors shall be expected to participate in two standing committees and chair one, ensuring active engagement in the committee process.
- 7. Standing committees meetings shall be held on a two month cycle.
- 8. To prevent conflicts of interest, councillors sitting on non-council boards or committees shall not hold officer positions within those boards or committees, such as president, secretary, or treasurer, however they may preside as chairperson where duly appointed by that board or committee.

Be it also resolved that the Resident Administrator amend any such by-laws as necessary to give effect to this resolution and present them for reading at the next meeting of council.
